



ARGENTINE SIDE OF IGUASSU FALLS

Train of the Jungle

The transportation inside of the Argentine National Park is done by the famous Train of the Jungle. It runs every half an hour regularly but during the picks of high season every 15 minutes back 'n' forth from the Devil's Throat to Cataratas stations. No need to pay extra for this service it's included on the entrance fee of the National Park.

Devil's Throat

The highlight of the Argentine Side, Devil's Throat really impresses all eyes. One can be standing right on top of it, the walk from the train station is 2 miles back 'n' forth, facilities and snack bar around at the station as well. The walk is totally flat no ups or downs at all. The Iguazu National Park provides special wheel chair for those who need it. It's impossible to predict how wet one is going to get but in sunny hot days You dry off fast!



Upper Path

At the Upper Path You can see all the falls You could not from the Devil's Throat. The Catwalk stands right on the egde of the falls giving an outstanding view and feeling from Iguassu. Capuchin Monkeys can be seen around very often, be aware. The length is 1.6 miles and no steps whatsoever. There is only one direction so do not come back from the same way You came.

Lower Path

The Lower Path gives a lower perspective to all those falls You see from the Upper Path. Be aware because there are more than a hundred steps all the way. If You do the Boat Ride You could skip the whole walking at the Lower Path, remember that in Iguassu Falls during the summer the temperature can go to 112 Fahrenheit. Besides You only get nice views at the corners of this path, so a lot of walk and than some views.



The tour starts with a Jungle Ride for about 2.5 miles in the middle of the sub-tropical rainforest around the Falls, followed by the boat ride which is super wet. The company provides water-proof rubber bags for backpacks, cameras and belongings but do not raincoats. Pay attention to the schedules since They have fix and few departures per day every one hour and a half.

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Argentine Side step by step

8:30A.M - DEPARTURE OF THE TRAIN FROM THE CENTRAL TRAIN STATION

Arrive at the Iguazu National Park around 08:00a.m, while You get settle up for a day tour our Tour Guide gets the entrance fee so You do not waste time. Do not use the restrooms in here, they are always busy, use the one at the train station. Follow to the Central Train Station, 7 minutes walk and line up for the first train of the day, a very special one hence it's the only one which goes all the way from the Visitors Center to the Devil's Throat directly.

09:00A.M - ARRIVAL AT THE DEVIL'S THROAT TRAIN STATION

The Catwalk to the Devil's Throat is totally flat, no ups or downs, 3/4 of a mile, average of 15 minutes one way. Pay attention to your surroundings You may spot Cormorants, Freshwater Turtles, J birds, Toucans and Caymans. At the end a large balcony over the falls from which You will have many different angles to the Devil's Throat. You will probably get wet, there is a spray which goes back 'n' forth, not too bad, however depending on the wind - which is totally unpredictatle - You may get a little more.

10:30A.M - DEPARTURE FROM THE DEVIL'S THROAT TRAIN STATION TO THE CATARATAS STATION

One hour and a half is enough to enjoy Devil's Throat, You can use the restrooms and drink a coffee or water. Make sure You be on time to catch this train to the Cataratas Station from where You go to the second walking tour of the day, the Upper Path.



Argentine Side step by step

10:45A.M - BEGINNING OF THE WALK AT THE UPPER PATH

At the Upper Path You will get to walk almost on the edges of Iguassu, the length is about 1.6 miles and also no steps. Capuchin Monkeys are often seen around the Upper Path so be aware they may show up, caymans as well, always basking in the sun over a rock.

12:15A.M - FINISH THE UPPER PATH

Once You finish this walk pay attention and turn left otherwise You will go back to the Cataratas Train Station. Turning left will lead You to the Food Square area and after the departure of the boat ride.

12:30P.M - STOP FOR LUNCH OR SNACKS

At the Food Square You can get a full meal, a hamburger or just a whammy empanada. Nice time to have a break and rest a little bit. Capuchin Monkeys and Quatis are around sometimes, be carefull.

02:00P.M - DEPARTURE TO THE BOAT RIDE

The Gran Aventura boat ride is a great way to finish the day in a relaxing-fun adventure, jungle ride with experts in fauna and flora and the boat ride at the end. You get wet, the company provides waterproof bags for backpacks but do not raincoats. It takes two hours so around 04:00p.m You will be drop off at the entrance of the Iguazu National Park, so no more lines or waiting for trains or walking.

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Argentine Side step by step Tips and insights

- If You are staying in a hotel at the Brazilian Side it will take around 1 hour to cross the border.
- From November the 4th 2018 to February the 17th 2019 it's the Brazilian Day light Saving, so Brazil will be one hour ahead of Argentina.
- At the cashier of the Argentine National Park They only accept national currency for the payment of the Entrance Fee.
- Public buses, in Brazil or Argentina are not usually on time, hard to figure out the right timing, specially once crossing the border.
- The volume of water at Iguassu depends 70% on rainfall and since there is no dry season You may come all year around.
- If You can avoid coming to Iguassu Falls around Easter, it is the most popular and busy time around the falls with almost 10 thousand people in the National Parks per day.
- Follow the suggestion of our step by step and do the Devi's Throat at the earliest time of the day, around the catwalk not so many trees to protect us from UV lights, besides being the coolest time there are less people around, easier to enjoy the balcony at the end of the walk.
- The only minor about the Gran Aventura boat ride is the amount of steps back 'n' forth, besides the company has a lot of restrictions regarding in ear devices, heart surgeries, any sort of knee or walking issues, pregnancy and mental conditions.
- The boat ride at the Brazilian side does not have the same restrictions as the Argentine one and it offers a lift service "cable-car" as an access to the Deck where it is the boarding on the boat.
